Course Title: World Literature I

Course Description: An introduction to literature; sampling of major masterpieces from the beginning of literature to around AD 1660.

Instructor: Bill Crumpler

Learning Outcomes:

Goal: During the course, the student will demonstrate a general knowledge of the major topics covered by scoring a C or better on the Unit Exams.

Course Objectives: (Note: "Paper" means the essay portion of the Unit Exams.)

1—The student will write a paper and master exams that express clear, critical thinking.

2—The student will write a paper and master exams that reflect standard English grammar usage.

3—The student will write a paper and master exams that reflect knowledge of literary themes and terminology.

Teaching Methodology, including description of interaction between student and instructor: Teaching methodology includes standard Blackboard methodology. Focus is on textbook reading assignments and Blackboard "Content Pages" online. The student should email the instructor often. Any questions over reading assignments should be addressed to the instructor before the student takes an exam.

Methods of Testing: Multiple-choice testing in Blackboard. Essay exam testing (full details explained in course syllabus).

Special Attendance Requirements (student contact with instructor, proctored examinations, etc.): Students are required to stay in contact with the instructor—weekly if possible.
