- 2. These courses are used to determine major courses in residency, see UAFS Graduation Requirements. The College of Business requires a C or better in each business course as well as an overall GPA of 2.00 across all major courses for graduation. Students may complete ECON 1003 at (SAU Tech) and transfer into UAFS to satisfy MGMT 1203 requirement.
- 3. Electives, 12 hours, select courses that will satisfy degree requirements for baccalaureate program. (SAU Tech) MATH 1023 College Algebra will count for 3 hours and ECON 1003 Personal Finance will count for 3 hours. Select additional elective hours with advisor.
- 4. Required Business Computing Competency may be fulfilled by successful completion of MIS 2053 Business Information Systems from (SAU Tech).
- 5. Students must complete these courses and earn a cumulative GPA of 2.5 to be admitted to the program.
- 6. Major Electives, 24 hours. Must be upper-level courses within the College of Business. See catalog for requirements.

7. Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521. (SAU Tech) BA 1103 Personal Finance will satisfy this requirement.
