Attack. The. Fire.

Fire scenes are complex and dynamic. The ever-evolving scene requires extensive oversight and management to provide as high a level of safety for firefighters as can be reasonable achieved while they aggressively perform their duties. Perhaps nothing can impact their safety or change a scene as quickly as an aggressive and well-planned fire attack. This class will provide opportunities to enhance skills related to getting water on a fire. Topics will include hoseline and nozzle selection and advancement and fire attack methods including direct, indirect and transitional. This course will include both classroom and hands-on components dealing specifically with fire attack from the on-scene apparatus to the fire and includes live fire scenarios.

Basic Pump Operations

This course is intended to familiarize participants with the basic principles of fire pumps, fire pump operation and maintenance. Pump operations, water supplies including tank and drafting theories will be discussed as well as maintenance, fire flow calculations and fire stream requirements.

Access and Assess: Getting to Your Patient

Firefighters face many unknown challenges while performing emergency medical services (EMS) and may be called upon to provide patient care in a variety of settings, from calm to chaotic. EMS providers frequently face difficulties in gaining access to patients to provide care and also in extracting patients to prepare for transport. A variety of techniques can be used to remove patients from their situation. Selecting and applying the appropriate technique for the situation along with providing appropriate assessment and care is the focus of this course. This course will include both classroom and hands-on elements dealing specifically with patient access, assessment and treatment with challenging scenarios.

Participants will perform portions of an automobile extrication, including vehicles not on their wheels, as part of the course requirements.

Alternative Fuel Vehicles

VEIS

Vent-Enter-Isolate-Search (VEIS) is a deliberate tactic for the immediate rescue of a fire victim. This tactic puts us in the immediate area of victims, or potential victim locations. This class will discuss and practice crew coordination, building construction and fire dynamics as well as demonstrating proper VEIS and quickly and safely removing victims from the IDLH environment

Managing Difficult Personalities on the Scene and in the Firehouse

This class will teach you how to recognize your dominant personality traits and those of others you're working with. Understanding how different temperaments interact together can assist in both scene management and coworker relationships within the firehouse. The skills learned can also be applied outside of the fire department to build a more dynamic homelife.

In this class, you will learn:

- -How to identify and interact with four different personality types.
- -How to appreciate the differences in personalities and use the knowledge on scene and in your work environment
- -How to identify if someone is an introvert or extrovert and utilize that information to build better communication in the workplace.
- -How to improve showing mercy, grace, and appreciation in the workplace based on personality types.

Basic ICS

This class introduces the ICS to fire service officers who use, deploy, implement, and/or function within an incident command organization. If you have minimal or zero experience with the Incident Command System, you should be in this class.

*Full PPE - includes functional and properly tested SCBA with a facepiece. Extra bottles are encouraged but not required. SCBA user must be clean shaven to participate in events requiring SCBA.

**Full PPE includes turnout coat, pants, helmet with faceshield, and gloves. If faceshield is unusable, goggles or glasses are required. Equipment must be within time use guidelines.

Some loaner equipment may be available. Rehab is provided. Breathing air is provided and bottles can be refilled. Dirty gear may be laundered at the fire academy prior to departure.
